



Interfaith Training Opportunity for Clergy on Domestic Violence

Domestic violence is an ongoing epidemic in our culture and in our faith communities. Religious leaders are often turned to by Victims of domestic violence as the first resource for understanding and help. This is both good and bad news. On the one hand it is good in the sense that victims intuitively feel they will be well

received, believed and understood in turning to their clergy. On the other hand it is bad because most clergy are inadequately trained and qualified to respond in a helpful manner. In fact they often unintentionally do more harm than good. But that does not have to be the case. Training is available.

Gethsemane Lutheran Church and A Community For Peace are offering a day long training event for clergy designed to:

- Increase your understanding and awareness of Domestic Violence;
- Increase your awareness of how clergy can more adequately respond by understanding and using the gifts of faith we are privileged to shepherd;
- Introduce you to a "Trauma Informed Response;"
- Establish relationships with trained Domestic Violence Response providers; and
- Build bridges between the faith community and Domestic Violence Responders.

A day long training event is being offered in four locations. Please see the registration form to choose your location. Training will be from 9:00 a.m. till 3:00 p.m. Lunch is included. There is a \$10 registration fee to cover the cost of lunch.

Wadi Foquin is a historic agricultural village in the West Bank of the Occupied Palestinian Territories. Since 2009 a United Methodist Community Development Partnership (CDP) with the village has continued to grow through Friends of Wadi Foquin and UM General Board of Global Ministries "Advance #3021565 ". Ata Manasra is the coordinator of the Wadi Foquin CDP. Ata is also a licensed tour guide and led the Holy Land tour hosted by Bishop Warner Brown last October.

The future of Wadi Foquin is now threatened by land confiscation orders; 1300 of its fruit trees have been demolished by Israeli bulldozers, and military orders were issued to stop construction of a soccer field. Hear the latest updates from Ata along with ways you can support the village.
